PROHIBITING INTENTIONAL DEAD STANDING TIMBER

WHEREAS, The Albion Little River Fire Protection District was formed pursuant to Health & Safety Code §13800; and

Whereas, Health & Safety Code Section 13861 gives The Albion Little River Fire Protection District the powers to enact ordinances; and

Whereas, Health & Safety Code Section 13862 list the powers of a Fire District to include the of Fire Districts organized under this section, including Fire protection services. And any other services related to protection of lives and property; and

WHEREAS, The Albion Little River Fire Protection District is comprised significantly of

Forest Lands; and

WHEREAS, standing but not downed dead hardwoods present an extreme fire danger,

which threatens the health and safety of rural residents; and

WHEREAS, such standing but not downed dead trees pose a life safety risk to

firefighters; and

WHEREAS, naturally occurring events result in dead standing timber from time to time;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Albion Little River Fire Protection

District ordains as follows:

Trees intentionally killed and left standing are a public nuisance.

Trees intentionally killed must be downed or otherwise removed within thirty days of initial act intended to

Trees not downed or otherwise removed within thirty (30) days of the date the act to destroy or kill said tree occurs shall be considered to endanger public health or public safety and may be abated pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 14875 etc.

PROHIBITING INTENTIONAL DEAD STANDING TIMBER

WHEREAS, The Albion Little River Fire Protection District is comprised significantly of Forest Lands; and

WHEREAS, standing but not downed dead hardwoods present an extreme fire danger, which threatens the health and safety of rural residents; and

WHEREAS, such standing but not downed dead trees pose a life safety risk to firefighters; and

WHEREAS, naturally occurring events result in dead standing timber from time to time; and

WHEREAS, if any section, subsection, sentence, phrase or clause of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance. The Directors of the District here declare that they would have adopted the Ordinance and each section despite the fact that one or more section, subsection, phrases or clauses be declared invalid:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Albion Little River Fire Protection District ordains as follows:

Trees intentionally killed and left standing are a public nuisance. Trees intentionally killed must be downed or otherwise removed within thirty days of initial act intended to kill tree(s).

VIOLATIONS

Persons who shall violate this ordinance shall be guilty of an infraction, which shall be punishable by a fine in accordance with Sections 17(d) of the currently adopted California Penal Code.

Any person who fails or refuses to correct or eliminate intentionally dead standing timber after written order of the District Board or its authorized representative is quilty of a misdemeanor, which shall be punishable by fine or imprisonment or both in accordance with Section 19 of the currently adopted California Penal Code. The imposition of a punishment pursuant to this paragraph shall neither excuse the violation, nor shall it authorize the violation to continue or preclude the District from taking other action to enforce compliance with this ordinance. All violations shall be corrected within ninety days regardless of whether a conviction is obtained. Each thirty days that a violation continues after due notice has been served, shall be deemed a separate offense.

Fine shall be ten dollars per intentional dead standing tree.

The District shall be entitled to recover all of its actual expenses incurred to correct violations and to obtain compliance.

DATE OF EFFECT

Pursuant to Section 36937 of the Government Code of the State of California, this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and affect thirty (30) days after its final passage.

MINUTES

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11, 2015 ALBION-LITTLE RIVER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT REGULAR BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING ALBION SCHOOL 30400 ALBION RIDGE RD, ALBION CA

- 1 The Board meeting was called to order at 8:00 pm by President Skyhawk. A quorum was present.
 - a. Call to Order and Roll Call: Attendance: Board Members: Chris Skyhawk, Bob Canclini, Sam Levine, Rich Riley, Scott Roat; Chief Ted Williams, Bookkeeper Sara Spring, Firefighters Steve Wolfe, Debbi Wolfe, Michael Issel, Joe Goforth, Greg Hathaway, Kyle LeMohn, John Oakley, Marshall Brown, Andrea Pennebaker, Andrew Crowningshield, Jaime Placido, Ben Jackson, Citlali Calvillo and guests Laurel LeMohn Karen Calvert Al Lawrence, Beth Bosk, Josh Latkin, Maggi Watson and Kirstin Brown.
 - b. The Agenda was approved.
- 2. The following Minutes were approved:
 - a. Annual Board Meeting February 4, 2015
 - b. Regular Board Meeting February 12, 2015
 - c. Special Board Meeting February \$23, 2015
- 3. Public Comment: There was no public comments.
- 4. Financial Report: The financial report was not available.
- 5. Items for Board Consideration and Possible Action:
 - a. Little River neighborhood disaster preparedness: Maggi Watson (937-4961) and Kirstin Brown (937-1725) presented their desire to develop a disaster preparedness plan for Little River. They requested use of the Barbecue site at Station 812 for a "Bring Your Own" picnic on May 2nd to interest the community in developing such a plan. The Board voted unanimously to sponsor the event with Firefighters there to help. Rich indicated that he would contact County DOT for this event.
 - b. Karen Calvert's & her son's Parcel Tax Situation: Bob met with the Staff at the County Assessors Office and it was confirmed that the parcel tax should have been base on Legal Parcels. Therefore, the Board Voted unanimously to reimburse Karen \$160.00 and her son \$120.00 to cover the erroneous charges. Karen suggested that these payments be made at the end of our fiscal year.
 - c. Improvements for Station 811: Sam reported that discussions with the County Planning Department and environmental Health that we cannot put in a pump-out septic system due to State and County laws.
 - d. Permit Status of Station 811: Sam reported that the Planning Department does not have a Use Permit for Station 811. We will have to straighten this out. The Use Permit to construct the full Fire Station designed by Bob Schlosser was pulled about a year ago when the request for a building permit for the latter was cancelled. [Sam believes that this station could not have been built because of the lack of an allowed septic system.] Part of Schlosser's design was to replace the existing Station 811 building. Note, the original Use Permit for 811 had been for storage only. By error, the the pulling of the Use Permit was applied to the existing building at 811.

- e. Improvements for Station 812: The board agreed that we would like to put in a septic system to support a kitchen and restrooms and possibly a shower and washing machine. Sam said he would try to contact the County regarding use of this County property to add these services. He will also ask about use of the North half of the Albion Transfer station (Dump).
- f. Repairs to Station 810: Sam met with the County Building Inspector, Kevin, to determine the needed repairs to Station 810. Kevin indicated that we could use the existing building to store two vehicles now. He said that we need to close up all holes in the walls, before we can use the building for Fire Department meetings and use the Kitchen after the hood is installed. Even after these repairs are made we cannot allow the use of the building for public meetings. He felt we could get a lot of donated material local contractors from their trash piles. Kevin thought that some contractors might be willing to donate time and material to help repair the building. Ted asked that we obtain the cost from Joe and a building contractor to repair Station 810. Ted is very concerned that we may be wasting money fixing 810 in lieu of the pending Albion Bridge replacement. We need to contact Frank Demling and/or Kenneth Harper of Caltrans regarding their plans for this construction and the impact on 810.
- g. Scott will try to set up a meeting with Amy Winn regarding the our use at Station 810 and 811 or in the vicinity of these stations.
- h. Adjusting the Maintenance Budget: We currently have enough monies in the budget to cover our current maintenance not counting repairs to Station 810.
- i. Metal Sheds at the Flats: We can add a metal Shed at the Albion flats to house the two Jet skies.
- **6. Proposed Ordinance "Prohibiting Intentional Dead Standing Timber: This** proposed ordinance was read and discussed. It was agreed that it should be sent to County Council for evaluation.
- **7. Secretary's Report:** The Board Members were again reminded to submit their Forms 700 to the County Assessors office no later than April 1st.
- 8. Director's Discussion: Nothing was presented.
- 9. The next Regular Board Meeting will be on April 8, 2015 at 7:00pm at the Albion School.
- 10. The meeting was Adjourned at 9:53 pm.

ALBION-LITTLE RIVER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT SPECIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING APRIL 1, 2015

ALBION SCHOOL 30400 ALBION RIDGE RD, ALBION, CA 95410

- 1 The Board meeting was called to order at 6:40 pm by President Skyhawk. A quorum was present.
 - a. Attendance: Board Members: Chris Skyhawk, Bob Canclini, Sam Levine, Rich Riley, Scott Roat; Chief Ted Williams, Bookkeeper Sara Spring, Firefighters Steve Wolfe, Debbi Wolfe and Michael Issel and guest Amy Wynn of Coastal Planning.
 - b. The Agenda was approved.

2. Planning Consultant Amy Wynn.

- a. Amy was introduced to the Board by Scott. She indicated her interest in working with the Board to evaluate potential properties that could meet our needs. She appeared to be very knowledgeable of the Coastal Commission requirements and limitations with regard to scenic views along Highway 1 and environmentally sensitive plants and animals through out their controlled regions.
- b. She asked a number of questions regarding our needs at Stations 811 and 812 and our interest in expanding the two facilities. The Board indicated the following with regard to the two Stations:
 - 811: Pump out septic system to support two toilets, a shower and washing machine and maybe a small kitchen.
 - 812: Septic system with drain field to support two toilets, a shower, washing machine and a home style kitchen.
- c. The Board and chief said that our main concern is our Main Station, 810, behind the Albion Market. The existing building is in bad need of repair at this time. The cost for the electrical repair is \$4000 and the cost for a general contractor to repair walls, etc. is unknown at this time. We do not own the parcel on which the building sits. The property is owned by the Latham family who would like to sell this parcel and their large surrounding parcels at fair market value. This could happen at any time. We do want our main station to be in this immediate area because it affects our Fire Insurance rating and it is central to our district. We are considering other locations, including purchasing a house.
- d. Sam told her and the board that he is in contact with a government group that manages county property, in particular, the location of Station 812 adjacent to the Liver River Airport and the north half of the Albion Transfer Station (the Albion Dump) for septic systems and facilities described above. The woman Sam talked to asked for some rough details of our needs which she will take to the Board of Supervisors. Sam could not recall the names of the organization or the woman's name. He said he would get that information to Amy, and the Board of Directors
- 3. The Fire Chief and the three firefighters left the meeting at about 7:30 pm.
- 4. Amy asked that all correspondence with her go through Scott.

- **5.** Amy asked for a retainer of \$500 so that she can begin working with us. She felt that because we a are a community service organization, we have high priority regarding our relations with the Coastal Commission.
- 6. Amy left the meeting about 8:10 pm.
- 7. The Board agreed to fund Amy and this will be voted on at our next meeting.
- **8.** No additional formal business was conducted by the Board. The meeting degenerated into off the cuff discussions among the Board Members including a desire to keep Station 810 and suggesting to the chief that a work party be formed to repair it.
- 9. The Next Board Meeting will be on April 8, 2015 at 7:00 pm at the Albion School. This meeting was Adjourned at 8:18 pm.

SUBSEQUENT TO THE MEETING:

Because it's germane to this meeting, Sam's correspondence on March 31st regarding installing septic systems on county properties at Station 812 and the parcel area north of the Albion Transfer Station (the Dump) was with Kristin McMeomey with the General Services Agency of the County. Kristin asked for some details of the ALRFPD needs and some details of the properties to be served by these septic systems, and she would take that to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration.

- a. 812: Kitchen, two toilet rooms, a shower and a washing machine and possibly a meeting facility.
- b. Albion Transfer Station (30180 Albion Ridge Rd) Two toilet rooms, shower, a washing machine, a small kitchen and probably a 4 or 5 bay engine and tender garage.

Sam told her he would provide her these details and some sketches of the existing and proposed new facilities on these properties this coming week.

Hi Amy,

Sorry I didn't get back to you sooner, but I've been a bit busy. Below is the more or less the conversation I had with Kristin McMeomey of the General Services Agency of the County on March 31st regarding installing septic systems at Station 812 at the Airport and at the Albion Transfer Station (Albion Dump). Kristin asked for some details of the ALRFPD needs at these locations and some details of the facilities to be served by these septic systems. She said she would take this data to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration. I gave her the following information:

- a. Station 812 at 43001 Little River Airport Rd: Kitchen, two toilet rooms, a shower and a washing machine and possibly a meeting room adjacent to the existing station.
- b. Albion Transfer Station (30180 Albion Ridge Rd) Two toilet rooms, a shower, a washing machine, a small kitchen and possibly a 4 or 5 bay engine and tender garage with a meeting room.

I do not believe that my working with Kristin has any affect on your efforts regarding one or more facilities to replace Station 810 and modifying Station 811. My work is really a backup to your efforts.

To bring you up to date regarding Station 811 at 32600 Albion Ridge Rd, the Planning Department does not have a Use Permit for the Existing Station 811 building because it was accidentally pulled. This occurred when The application for a building Permit to construct a new Fire Station designed by Bob Schlosser at this location was cancelled, I believe on January 10, 2014. Part of Bob's design included replacing the existing wooden structure at 811 with a larger metal framed building. Because the new design overlapped the existing building, the Use Permit for the latter was also cancelled by the Planning and Building Department in error. Because I was involved in this whole shebang, I should go to the Planning and Building Department in Fort Bragg and meet with them. Note, I still have the contract drawings of Bob's design which clearly shows the overlap.

Note also, the existing vehicle bays at both Stations 811 and 812 are too low and too narrow for modern Fire Engines. The two bays at Station 811 are also too short. Eventually the <u>vehicle</u> garaging will have to be rectified for which we have potential ideas and rough designs.

As I am sure Scott has told you, our most pressing problem is a permanent solution to the Station 810's facilities of a septic system, a toilet room, a shower room, a washing machine and a meeting room. Also, most important, is the local vicinity of 810 and 811 is central to our District. Note, the majority of our firefighters live in Albion.

Hi, Just a nagging reminder than a written submission now from ALRFPD expressing concerns regarding community transportation response arising from the need of a central station and 24/7 emergency bridge access due to increased fire loads should be made either at the forthcoming NOP meeting and/or in writing before their 7 March deadline. The reason is that early submissions are considered first when shaping various agency mitigations that follow when shaping the draft EIR. If our concerns are not expressed clearly and early, then when responding later to the draft EIR we will be confronted with a shower of packaged boiler-plate responses that require an enormous effort to overcome. So it's a rifle shot now or a nuclear exchange later. Your call.

An expression of ALRFPD concerns from this private community member was made with the following response recorded below:

As regards Albion Bridge, *the product is the process*. As complete an inventory of community concerns as possible incorporated into Caltrans CEQA process for subsequent regulatory agency review will insure graceful, timely progression through each agency with permitting jurisdiction. Core issues raised late in the process will delay permitting and associated inter-agency decision dependency. With a view in mind to influence mitigation factors such as bridge approach location and 24/7 access favorable to ALRFPD objectives, offering early documented concerns to Caltrans will condition mitigation considerations moving forward through their CEQA process.

First:

Creation of increased fire load from dead tree forest practice during increased drought conditions is an important Caltrans mitigation concern directly affecting emergency access requirements during construction or rehabilitation. Such mitigation measures will affect how bridge traffic closures/interruptions are made *and* their duration. Submission to Caltrans of fire load hazard materials and photos from ALRFPD will possess more gravitas than from an individual resident. *Suggested Action:* Ted forward forest practice ordinance and photo materials to Frank Demling.

Second:

A statement from ALRFPD regarding the highly desirable "central service" location of 810 will also have a mitigating effect on the ultimate roadbed position to the Albion bridge. It would be yet another weighting factor to diminish a less likely Eastern approach consideration requiring additional costs for property acquisition, foundation pier siting, additional costs of Northern roadway access to Road 403 and Flats, retaining wall costs, project duration extension, and greater native plant / butterfly study mitigations.

Suggested Action: Ted or Board forward a letter to Frank Demling advising Caltrans of 810 desirable location factors.

Lastly:

Given Frank's understanding, the consensus engineering and project planning opinion is that a Westerly approach offers the lowest cost, highest value, shortest duration, safest roadway traffic flow, and lowest community impact alternative. It also offers the option of retaining the old bridge as pedestrian access along the Pacific Coast Trail. (The issues remains, however, who can afford to maintain the bridge when Caltrans abandons title @ ~\$200K to 400K/year). The California Coastal Commission historically has favored maintaining existing roadbed alignments. So a "Central" alignment along existing roadway would entail construction of half a new bridge while maintaining the existing bridge, then interrupting traffic flow while dismantling the old bridge, then completing the Eastern half of a new bridge. This alternative is by far the most expensive and Frank estimates would extend the project several years longer, while having the highest adverse impact on traffic flow, noise, and community services on roadbed location choices.

Suggested Action: Consider proceeding with 810 emergency repairs, etc., with low probability of concern that Caltrans will exert rights of eminent domain.

Many factors have combined to increase the risk to fire fighters, and residents of communities adjacent to timber operations in Mendocino County. These include drought, insect infestation and invasive pathogens such as *P. ramorum*, and even the County's inability to properly maintain access roads.

The ordinance before you attempts to address another factor: the popular practice of using herbicides to kill unwanted species of trees in the wake of timber harvest operations.

According to the Mendocino County Department of Agriculture, 1022 gallons of the herbicide Imazapyr, in three different types, was used to treat 6838 acres of forest land in 2014. Mendocino Redwood Company alone used 758 gallons to treat 4752 acres followed by Campbell Timberland Management which used 114 gallons to treat 923 acres. Even the environmentally-sensitive Conservation Fund used a small amount of the herbicide (8 gallons) to treat a small amount of their property (36 acres). It is worth noting that Imazapyr is not the only herbicide used in the County for the purpose of eliminating tan oak and other broadleaf species. It is more important to note that this practice has been going on for many years, resulting in a proliferation of perhaps millions of dead trees on the landscape. For example, it is estimated that MRC has already treated, cumulatively, approximately 85,000 acres of their holdings in Mendocino and Sonoma counties.

Stopping the practice of intentionally leaving dead standing timber, through local or statewide public pressure, will not bring an end to the dangerous conditions we face countywide. Some would say that it is more crucial for homeowners to create "defensible space" around their structures or for the County to clear brush from roadways and create more turnouts so that emergency vehicles and fleeing residents do not meet head-on during fire events. Others urge a full study of all conditions of risk countywide before taking the step of declaring a single practice to be a public nuisance.

It is also the case that timber companies are not unaware of the dangers and want to help address them. Recently, I attended a tour of the Halfway to Hell THP with MRC foresters. The company is going out of its way to explain their strategies, both short and long-term, to the public and offering to take concrete actions to quell the legitimate fears of residents. For example, MRC has offered to construct firebreaks and water storage facilities in the areas most directly affected by timber harvests. We do not want to sacrifice the good will evident in these efforts. We do not want a return to the "timber wars" of decades gone by.

However, I would urge you, as directors, to use the legal authority vested in you to increase the security of the residents of your district. Mendocino County Counsel Doug Losak has found that you are authorized, under sections of the government code and the Health and Safety Code of which you are aware, to challenge "any timber operations which endangers public health or public safety". There is little question that the practice of intentionally leaving dead standing timber fits this definition. In so doing, you will not end the imminent danger of fire in the areas under your jurisdiction, but you will make a statement that you intend to take every step possible to mitigate the risks

§ 820.2. Exercise of discretion

Except as otherwise provided by statute, a public employee is not liable for an injury resulting from his act or omission where the act or omission was the result of the exercise of the discretion vested in him, whether or not such discretion be abused.

§ 821. Adoption of, or failure to adopt, enactment; Failure to enforce enactment

A public employee is not liable for an injury caused by his adoption of or failure to adopt an enactment or by his failure to enforce an enactment.

§ 821.2. Determination as to issuance, denial, suspension or revocation of license or similar authorization

A public employee is not liable for an injury caused by his issuance, denial, suspension or revocation of, or by his failure or refusal to issue, deny, suspend or revoke, any permit, license, certificate, approval, order, or similar authorization where he is authorized by enactment to determine whether or not such authorization should be issued, denied, suspended or revoked.

Cal Gov Code § 821.2

California's Government Claims Act (Act; Gov. Code, § 810 et seq.) confers immunity from tort liability on public employees when they make "basic policy decisions" in a legislative capacity. (See Gov. Code, §§ 820.2, 821, 821.2.)1. We hold that HN1? public employees' tort immunity for legislative decisionmaking applies even when that decisionmaking is also alleged to involve the making of misrepresentations motivated by "actual fraud, corruption or actual malice." (§ 822.2.) For this reason and others, we affirm the dismissal of plaintiffs' suit against a city and five city council members for nearly \$2 million in compensatory damages, plus punitive damages, for voting against an application for building permits and variances.
