#### FIRE FIGHTERS WORKERS COMP INJURY CLAIMS & RESPONSE POLICY

Protection District (ALRFPD) that active duty regular volunteer firefighters who have a current or active claim should not respond to emergency calls, or active training as a participant. Prior to returning to active duty, any employee requiring a medical leave of absence due to injury covered by District Workers Compensation Insurance must provide the District with a "fit for duty" evaluation (availability at District expense from an independent physician who has expertise in the covered injury, but who is not involved with the employee's treatment for the injury) before applying for reinstatement to active duty status. (Per By Laws Section 1190 "Personnel, Section 4, Paragraph d").

Non Fire Department workers comp claim: A Firefighter who is on a workers claim with another entity (not fire department/district related) should notify the Chief or District Board of Directors and not respond to emergency calls. The Firefighter may resume full duties as an active firefighter upon clearance from their doctor with written documentation. The District adopts the policy to protect all Firefighters. A hearing may be requested.

Policy adopted at Aug. 13, 2014 Regular Business Meeting by unanimous vote of Board of Directors.

#### **ALRFPD 12 YEAR PLAN INTRODUCTION**

MISSION: The mission of the ALRFPD is to provide first response protection to residents and visitors of life and property in the Albion & Little River communities against threats from structural and wildland fires, medical emergencies, hazardous materials releases, and disasters, natural or man made. To accomplish this, the ALRFPD will recruit, train and equip volunteer personnel so they can safely and professionally accomplish their mission. The purpose of this plan is to provide year to year continuity in prioritizing the critical ALRFPD needs in an austere fiscal environment.

To accomplish this requires the coordination of (3) groups: 1) firefighters, 2) auxiliary and 3) board of directors.

The volunteer firefighters are dedicated, passionate, hard workers, and are on call 24/7. Without them, there would be no fire department. You cannot put a price on this type of protection.

Our annual budget is less than the cost of one paid full time firefighter. Our budget has to cover 5 stations/buildings, 10 vehicles, 3 water vehicles and maintenance all of these items. In addition, the budget must also cover supporting equipment, all necessary protective clothing, insurance & fuels.

Insurance Service Office (ISO) rates fire departments to their standards after evaluation of the number of personnel, fire fighting equipment & resources, water supplies, water flow rates and response times

Fire insurance companies use these fire department ratings, distances from fire houses and water supplies, plus other fire risk factors to determine your insurance cost or lack of insurability.

Due to the drought and ISO inspections, we are still trying to determine any necessary equipment upgrades to be included in our final 12 Year Plan Costs. With your help, the added revenue from the fire tax increase will help replace ageing equipment and maintenance costs, putting us in a better position to protect you. #### Questions about Measure M

#### What will this measure do?

If approved by 2/3 of the voters, the Measure will:

- (1) increase the current parcel tax assessment for properties within the Albion-Little River Fire Protection District from \$40 per unit to \$75 per unit; AND
- (2) extend the assessment to include unimproved Timber Production, Forest, and Range lands (currently exempt from the parcel tax).

These changes will increase revenues for the District by approximately \$71,000 from the increased assessment rate, and \$34,000 from adding Timber, Forest, and Range lands.

#### What's a "unit?"

It's the measure used to assess the tax on different types of parcels. Unimproved residential property is assessed at one unit. Improved property (any land with a house or other building) is assessed at two units. Trailer parks and modular home developments (*The Woods*) are assessed 2 units for the property, plus 1 per residence. Nonresidential timber, forest, and range lands are currently exempt, but if Measure M passes, they will be assessed at one unit per 30 acres.

#### If Measure M passes, what good will it do me?

You will enjoy the benefits of improved emergency services. We all hope never to experience the kind of event that triggers a 911 call, but if you do, you want to know that the people who respond - your neighbors and friends, in this case - will have the equipment and training to rescue you or protect your home. Volunteer firefighters are the first responders to any emergency call within the District. With the additional revenue from this measure, the Fire Department will be able to replace some of the aging and unreliable equipment these people - and you - rely on.

#### What happens if the measure doesn't pass?

The District is already facing budget deficits, and if nothing is done, will run out of money in about two years. This may mean that:

- The number of volunteer firefighters will be reduced
- Equipment will not be replaced when it fails
- Volunteer firefighter training will be reduced
- Emergency services will be reduced
- Fire Stations may have to be closed
- The District may not be able to maintain the current insurance rating.

#### What's that about insurance?

Insurance companies base their rates for fire insurance on ratings developed by a standards organization (ISO). One key element of the rating system is the distance from your home to the nearest fire station: if it is more than five miles, insurance companies will either charge much higher rates, or refuse to provide insurance to you. Our Fire District currently meets this standard, because we have equipment distributed at several locations around the District. If one of our engines or water trucks dies, or if the District is forced to close a substation, we may no longer meet that standard - and if that happens, the parcel tax will look cheap. Residents of the Little Valley Road area north of Fort Bragg were in this situation, and faced potential rate increases of up to \$4,000 per year.
