Hi Janie,

The district's lease agreement with the county allows the district to let other groups use the barbeque grounds under certain conditions - The district can give permission for use by up to 200 people maximum. If the district gives permission for use of the barbeque grounds the district is on the hook for security and public protection. Last year we had a private party request for use of the grounds and we gave permission on condition that they provide proof of an agreement for provision of security services by a security agency or off duty law enforcement and proof of liability insurance. The district provides insurance and the fire department provides its own security for fire department events. The department did provide security for the private fire department fund raiser last fall, but they were able to do that by becoming co-sponsors of the event. If your group can meet these conditions (<200 people, provide security and liability insurance) we may be able to allow you to use the barbeque grounds. We are required to notify the county at least 15 days in advance of any event.

Let me know by next Friday if you want to make the request and I will put it on the agenda for our next business meeting (April 27, 2010). Keep in mind that if the request is not on our posted agenda we will not be able to vote on a request made at the meeting. If you think there will be more than 200 people you might want to contact the director of the county department of transportation directly, as the district does not have exclusive use of the grounds, and they may be able to give you permission directly.

- 4. **DISTRICT** will not store equipment, other than wooden picnic benches, or materials outside of building, unless requested by the **DISTRICT** in writing and approved by the **COUNTY** in writing.
- 5. **DISTRICT** shall confine its use of the building and appurtenant area to fire fighting activities, unless specified otherwise in this agreement or requested by the **DISTRICT** in writing and approved by the **COUNTY** in writing.

## SECTION II. PICNIC AND RECREATIONAL AREA

- COUNTY shall permit DISTRICT to use an approximately three acre site located adjacent to the DISTRICT'S firehouse along the easterly side of the AIRPORT access road for a picnic and recreational area, as described in Exhibit "A".
- 2. The **DISTRICT'S** use of the site shall be principally for the Albion-Little River Volunteer Fire Department's, hereinafter referred to as the **DEPARTMENT**, annual fundraiser barbeque.
- 3. **DISTRICT'S** use of the site shall be nonexclusive; but **DISTRICT** shall have priority of use to hold **DEPARTMENT'S** annual barbeque.
- 4. **DISTRICT** may allow the occasional day use of the site by other groups for picnic and recreational use for groups of less than 12 people who are monitored and supervised by the **DISTRICT**. Groups of 12 or more, but less than 200 people who are monitored and supervised by the **DISTRICT** shall be scheduled at least fifteen days in advance with a ten day written notice to the **COUNTY**'S Director of Transportation. **DISTRICT** shall not allow use of the site for groups of 200 or more people. **DISTRICT** shall allow amplified music only at a maximum of five events per year, including the annual **DEPARTMENT** barbeque. **COUNTY** reserves the right to not permit amplified music if the music creates a nuisance for nearby neighbors. **DISTRICT** shall not allow use of the site in excess of thirty days for all combined uses. **DISTRICT** shall not unlawfully discriminate in excluding individuals or groups from use of the site because of race, color, religion, sex, marital status, national origin or ancestry.
- 5. **DISTRICT** shall provide for security and protection of the public using the site, when the **DISTRICT** has approved the use.
- 6. No signs shall be displayed on the site without the express written approval of the **COUNTY**'S Director of Transportation. Requests for such signs shall be in writing to the **COUNTY**'S Department of Transportation.

With this obligation in mind, the pool remains extremely liquid in light of the continuing budget issues that are surrounding the State of California. Liquidity needs severely impact investment types; therefore, the pool is weighted in the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) and the California Asset Management Program (CAMP). Funds in both LAIF and CAMP are accessible with same-day notice.

Due to the current financial environment, interest apportionment rates are at a historically low rate and will more than likely continue that way for the next several months. If you have any questions regarding this report or the investments reported, please do not hesitate to contact me.
