Firefighters,

I'm pleased to see our cliff program restructuring as core rescue skills as opposed to the specialized team model. Firefighters use ropes, knots and associated gear for all sorts of rescue, including vehicles over embankments. The large turnout at recent cliff events convinces me we'll be safer and more effective going forward. I see the components of our cliff effort as:

- 1) Equipment. We're fairly well stocked. We have a complete inventory. We have budget for the necessary additional tools.
- 2) Interest. We had nine volunteers attend the weekend-long Rescue 3 course at Mendocino Fire. We have a few more who were interested, but couldn't commit to the particular weekend.
- 3) Interoperability. We want to blur the district lines. By co-training with Mendocino, our methods should align on incident. Being able to back each other up is a significant net gain to the community. It also adds some enthusiasm seeing different faces.
- 4) Training. We can cover basic knots and methods in house, but until we have instructor-level volunteers, I believe we need to send teams out to certified training facilities. CMC is the obvious choice. We have seven firefighters interested in attending the CMC Tech 1/2 week long course in March. We have budget for two. I've been discussing the budgetary issue with our board members and training officer. It's fantastic that we have so many volunteers willing to take a week off work to train and everyone wants to send the whole group. Competing needs like hose for 8171 (the new wildland truck), body vacuum splints (to satisfy changing EMS protocol) and PPE for recently joining firefighters make robbing other budget categories difficult to justify. I recommend we send Michael Rees and Citlali Calvillo in March. They were first on the list and are both committed to sharing their knowledge upon return. Marshall believes our CMC crew from the prior session (~4 years ago) may return at no cost so long as they attend a sessions with the same instructors. I'm working to verify that they'll be able to participate (as opposed to just watching), but this looks like a promising route to renew certification. Bringing instructors to us does not appear to be a viable route to cost savings. Getting our folks certified at instructor level might be a long term solution, but doesn't help us now.

There was a very lengthy discussion on the pros and cons of raising the assessment and what the needs of the District are. It was discussed that a sales tax as an option would not be worth it in a small district such as ours. If no action was taken at current spending requirements the District would be out of money in 1 to 2 years. There was discussion on what the new assessment should be and if it should be indexed to increase over a period of time. After many different options were presented Skyhawk made a motion to increase the assessment to \$75 per year with no index, so that most properties assessment would be \$75 times 2 (one for land, one for structure) Approved unanimously 5-0.

RESOLUTION 14-02-26

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ALBION-LITTLE RIVER FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, ALBION, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION ON AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A SPECIAL TAX INCREASE FOR FIRE PROTECTION, PREVENTION, SUPPRESSION, AND ALL RELATED SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE FIRE DISTRICT. A SPECIAL ELECTION IS CALLED FOR ON JUNE 3, 2014.

Whereas, at its meeting on February 12, 2014, the Board of Directors of Albion-Little River Fire Protection District set the time and place for consideration of adoption of such ordinance as February 26, 2014, at 1:00 P.M., at the Albion-Little River Fire House, Albion, CA 95410; and

Whereas, this Board, pursuant to section 53978 of the California Government Code, on behalf of the district adopts an ordinance imposing a special tax increase to be used to maintain and improve the current level of fire protection, prevention, suppression, emergency medical, hazardous materials response, search, and rescue services. In addition, the increase will be directed toward procurement, equipping, operating, and maintaining equipment, and, for the purpose of paying salaries of personnel or any related services. The special tax, for all units, of the special tax per year shall be assessed on all real property (except that of Federal, State, or Government agencies or other property which is exempt from taxation) within the boundaries of said Albion-Little River Fire Protection District; and

Whereas, the tax shall be collected in the same manner provided by statute for the collection of property tax; and

Whereas, each year prior to the imposition of said tax, the District's Board of Directors shall cause a report to be prepared, showing each parcel, the owner(s) thereof, and the proposed levy thereon. At said meeting the Board of Directors shall make such corrections to the tax proposed to be levied as may be required to conform to the fees as set forth herein; and

Whereas, if a two-thirds voter approval is cast, the special tax will become effective concurrent with the 2014/2015 Property Tax billing cycle with a rate of \$75.00 per unit; and

Whereas, if any section, subsection, sentence, phrase or clause of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance. The Directors of the District here declare that they would have adopted the Ordinance and each section despite the fact that one or more section, subsection, phrases or clauses be declared invalid;

Whereas, the ordinance adopted by the Board, must, by law, be submitted to the qualified voters of the District, whose approval by a two-thirds vote of those casting ballots is required if the tax is to become effective.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Albion-Little River Fire Protection District calls for an election to be held on June 3, 2014, and further requests the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors to consolidate said election with other elections on that same day; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the appropriations limit for the District shall be increased by the amount of the tax money raised by the imposition of this tax; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the foregoing uniform schedules and rates, attached hereto as Exhibit 1, shall be applied to the parcels within the District; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the question placed before the voters reads as follows:

Shall the Albion-Little River Fire Protection District, by Ordinance, (1) Repeal the existing special tax of \$40.00 per unit, (2) Replacing it with a special tax not to exceed \$75.00 per unit, this special tax shall be used to maintain and improve fire protection, suppression activities, prevention, and to acquire and maintain equipment or apparatus, and to increase our medical and rescue services, (3) Increase the appropriations limit by the increase of revenue raised by the tax?

Be It Further Resolved, that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its confirmation by the voters in the District. Special tax increase must be approved by two-thirds vote of the voters of the Albion-
